The 2nd Japan-India Road Engineering Seminar

--- Technical Exchange in the road and bridge sectors between Japan and India---

On September 4, 2025, the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism (MLIT), Japan, and the Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) held “The 2nd Japan-India Road Engineering Seminar” in Mumbai, India.

This seminar focused on the theme of “Marine Road Construction and Maintenance.” At the seminar, the Indian side introduced the “Mumbai Coastal Road Project”, while the Japanese side presented bridge-related technologies. This seminar aims to promote the development of future project opportunities in Mumbai.

The Japan-India Road Engineering Seminar has been held since 2024 in collaboration with the MMRDA. The seminar aims to foster future project development by facilitating information sharing between the government and private sectors of both countries on projects and technologies related to "Marine Road Construction and Maintenance."

(3) Summary of proceedings

- Following an introduction by the Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) outlining the concept and planning overview of the Mumbai Coastal Road Project (Uttan-Virar Sea Link), the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism (MLIT) presented measures for extending the service life of Japanese roads.
- Five Japanese companies introduced their technologies related to “Marine Road Construction and Maintenance”, followed by an exchange of opinions.
- Through the seminar, project information and relevant Japanese technologies in the road sector were shared between the two countries. It was confirmed that technical exchanges will continue to further strengthen cooperation between the two nations.
